- The White House - Lexington, Concord, Boston Massacre Site, Old North Church - Plymouth Plantation/Plymouth Rock - Capitol Building
- Broadway play (*Wicked, King Kong*, etc) - Statue of Liberty - Lincoln Memorial - Smithsonian Museums - Independence Hall and Liberty Bell
- Mt. Vernon (home/burial place G. Washington) - Arlington National Cemetery - View the Declaration of Independence and Constitution
- World Trade Center Memorial - Vietnam, Jefferson, Marine, FDR, WWII & Korean Memorials - Tour NYC (Times Square, Wall St., Central Park)
- Ford's Theater - Harvard University - Tour the Mayflower II - Dine at Quincy Market, Times Square, Zuccotti Park, National Mall, etc
